WHEREAS, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act included emergency paid sick leave and an expansion of the Emergency and Family and Medical Leave effective April 1, 2020 and expiring December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has desires to extend the benefits and terms of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act to March 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City Council identifies that said benefits provided by the Act will be beneficial to city employees and as such, desire to extend said benefits until March 31, 2021 only; and

WHEREAS, the City Council acknowledges that benefits extended by the Act previously expired on December 31, 2020 and the Council seeks to extend those benefits voluntarily as its policy; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes it is in the best interest of its employees and the community to extend said benefits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the City of Clarksville hereby extends the benefits provided under the Families First Coronavirus Response Act to March 31, 2021 and only for said time period. This resolution and policy is not meant to extend benefits past March 31, 2021 and said benefits are being provided voluntarily by the City in this matter as a result of the emergency and pending pandemic.
